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# A Message From Our Founder & Director

It's not about the getaway, it's what the getaway brings; hope.

All the children, young people and families referred to the Magical Getaway Foundation have experienced trauma. Experiences include, but are not limited to, poverty, sexual abuse, family violence, neglect, ongoing medical issues, homelessness and separation from a parent/carer.

These overwhelming experiences leave a person, feeling helpless, vulnerable and very frightened.

Children can develop an expectation that bad things will happen to them, forming relationships with other people is a huge challenge, they have trouble managing or regulating feelings and behaviour and find it hard to develop a positive sense of themselves.

Emotional and cognitive responses experienced by parents or carers include guilt and shame about their child's/children's experiences, reduced feelings of competence as a parent or carer, anger and blame.

Without a circuit breaker, the cycle continues, nothing changes!

# Happy Place Art Exhibition

What better way to express the joy, healing and hope of a getaway than through art. From this idea, the Happy Place Art Exhibition was born.

With the financial backing from Dandenong Council's Arts, Festivals and Events Stream, MGF was able to hold this two-day event at the beautiful Heritage Hill Museum and Historic Gardens in June 2023. Participants were encouraged to design on canvas their idea of a Happy Place.

Using paint as the medium, we sent the call out to Dandenong residents to start thinking and designing their happy place to put to canvas.

There were 260 participants from the Dandenong area alone and an additional 40 participants from elsewhere in Australia.



The art show was open to children, young people and adults aged from 4 to 80 years from twelve diverse organisations in Dandenong's municipality. The specific organisations were Bob's Place, Viv's Place, Burke and Beyond, Calvary Scottvale, Mercy Place Dandenong, Belvedere Aged Care, Dandenong South Primary School, Dandenong Primary School, Dandenong Valley Special Developmental School, Fifth Avenue Childcare Centre, Dandenong Day Nursery and Springvale Service for Children.

After sending out 260 canvases, paints and brushes to participating organisations and individuals, it was over to the artists to paint their version of a Happy Place. The community produced 300 paintings for public viewing at the Exhibition.

The event was officially opened by Greater Dandenong Council's Deputy Mayor, Lana Formoso. There was live music in the gardens, coffee and food trucks available on the grounds for all attendees to enjoy while wandering through the art work.

While the Happy Place Art Exhibition did not raise the funds the Foundation had hoped for, it was the relationships built with community organisations and individuals that was invaluable.






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# Fundraising

Sharing these cards with friends and family during the Christmas season allowed us to convey the profound changes the Foundation has enabled in the lives of many.



#### Outdoor and Indoor Markets

One of our new fundraising initiatives was the Magical Getaway Foundation Market.

We originally held it monthly at the Frederick Wachter Reserve in Keysborough commencing in October 2022.

There were over 25 stalls at our first market. With torrential rain and flooding in November, we regrettably had to cancel our 40 plus stall holders. Again, in December we commenced, but the high winds proved to be undefeatable.

Not to be defeated, our market commenced again in March 2023 at the Menzies Hall in Dandenong.

Unfortunately, we had the stall holders, but not the desired 'foot traffic'.

Our market ceased in May 2023.

We will be re-igniting our market at another location next year!!





### Financial Overview

The Magical Getaway Foundation reported an operating surplus of \$13,110 for the financial year ending 30 June 2023 (a 60% increase from 2021/2022).


We gifted 6 families (8 parents and 14 children in total) with their first ever getaways. The grant received from Dhelk Dja North Metro Action Group funded the getaways in November 2022 and May 2023.

Our fundraising activities included Trash to Treasure, Happy Place Art Exhibition, Christmas Cards and our indoor/outdoor market.

We'd like to acknowledge and sincerely thank the generosity of so many individuals and organisations for their financial and in-kind support.

We will continue next year to strengthen our financial (and non-financial) position so we can gift more first ever getaways to vulnerable Australian children and their families to bring hope.
